

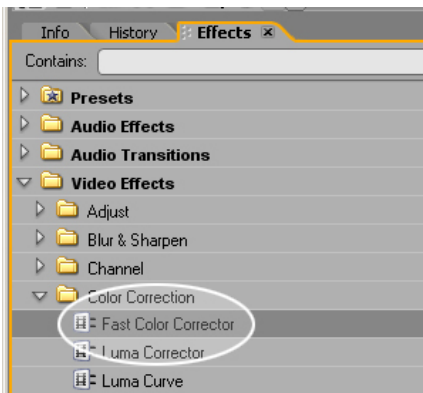


*This is a very basic tutorial on how you can quickly color correct your rendered out movie.*

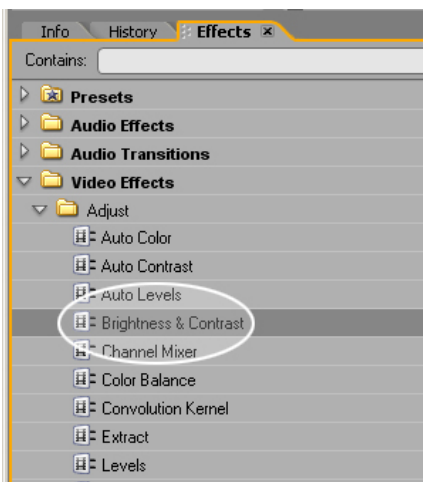
**Requirements:**

Premiere  
Ability to Read

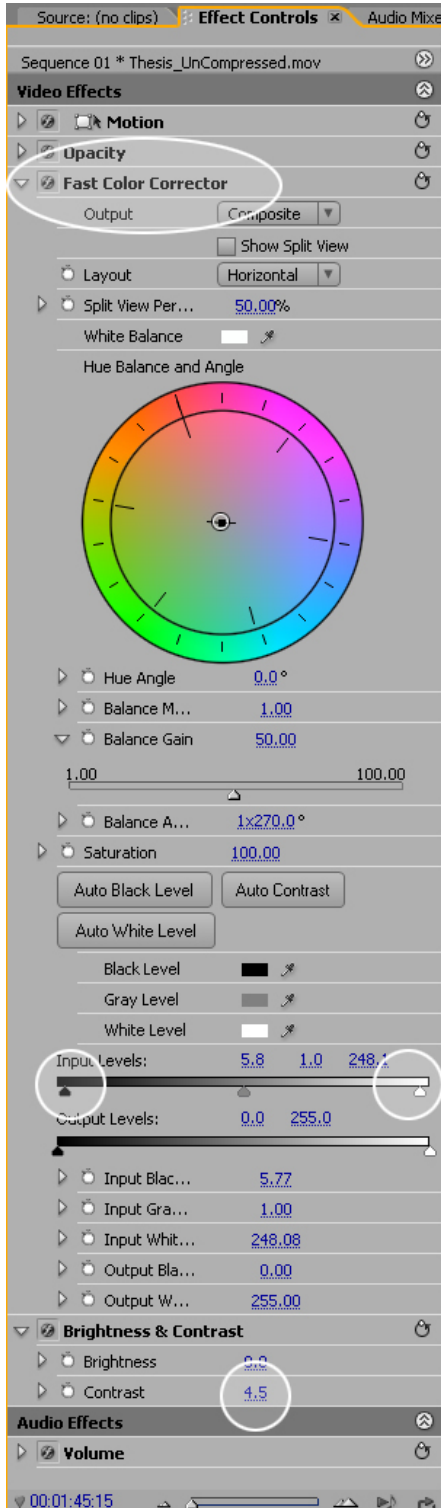
1. First, render out your entire movie uncompressed.
2. Create a new Premiere folder and import your uncompressed movie.
3. In the effects tab select "Fast Color Corrector" and drag and drop it onto your movie.



4. In the effects tab select "Brightness & Contrast" and drag and drop it onto your movie.



Now to adjust the settings:



3. Take about 5% off the black and about 5% off the white in the Input Levels of the "Fast Color Corrector" video effect.

4. Add about 5% to the Contrast part of the "Brightness and Contrast" video effect.

5. Export your movie with your compression of choice.

**Notes:**

Saturating a movie will make the file size a little larger. I needed to make my exported movie 0.05% smaller and by lowering the contrast from 5% to 4% I was able to do so.
